WORLD NAKED BIKE RIDE RETURNS TO MADISON JUNE 16

Naked Madison bicyclists take to the streets for a third year

MADISON — Local naked bicyclists will brave the streets for a third year in a row in a celebration of body acceptance that creatively protests fossil fuel dependence.

The ride will begin at 11:00 AM, June 16, 2012, at a location to be announced at least 24 hours in advance.

Anyone with a human-powered means of conveyance and an adventurous spirit is invited to join. Bicycles and inline skates are typical, but past rides have seen such vehicles as unicycles and recumbent trikes.

The ride is a fun way to celebrate the beauty of the human body, no matter what one's age, size, or shape. All are welcome. The body is never a shameful thing, and there is no need to cover it up or hide it away.

It is also a rare opportunity to make a bold fashion statement, even if the fashion is one's own skin. "Bare as you dare" is the slogan; participants are encouraged to wear as much or little as they feel is comfortable. While many riders valiantly bare all, others wear paint, masks, or creatively colorful but minimalist costumes that lend a festive air of parade to the event.

Finally, and not of least importance, we ride to protest our country's ongoing dependence on fossil fuel, an increasingly scarce and expensive resource that contributes to societal problems ranging from climate change to war, from pollution to obesity. Riding naked draws attention to cycling as a clean, healthy, and attractive alternative to motorized transportation.

The first World Naked Bike Ride took place in 2004. Events were held in 28 cities, in ten countries and four continents, according the event page on the Wikipedia web site. By 2010, the event had grown to include rides in 74 cities and 17 countries.
