The World Naked Bike Ride (WNBR) is an annual event that draws attention to the absurdity of oil dependency and celebrates the potential of cycling and the human body. The overuse of the planet's vanishing oil reserves causes pollution, global warming and leads to war, inequality and injustice. Many politicians want to subsidise the car industry and build more roads and runways. They call such follies progress - but this is progress towards disaster.

WNBR is an international movement with rides taking place in over forty locations in the UK and around the world. Riding naked emphasises the vulnerability of cyclists on the road at the same time as celebrating humanity in the face of mechanisation. The dress-code is actually As Bare As You Dare. No one will pressure you to take off more than you want to.
